



## Introduction

Low Carbon Industrial (LCI) is a UK-based manufacturer and distributor of low-carbon surface materials for the architecture and design sector. Our commitment is to ensure that the materials we make and the materials we source reflect the same principles that guide our work: clarity, accountability and care.

## Our Business and Supply Chains

LCI creates and curates materials that prioritise low carbon thinking, design, and the considered use of waste streams. Our supply chains include:

- Raw material suppliers including wood waste, minerals, resins and other composite inputs
- Components and consumables used in manufacturing
- Fabrication and finishing partners
- Logistics and distribution providers
- International manufacturing partners for specific product ranges

We work with suppliers who demonstrate transparency and thoughtful sourcing, and whose practices support our focus on reduced impact and honest material production.

## Our Commitment

We do not accept any form of modern slavery in our organisation or our supply chains. We expect all suppliers and partners to uphold high standards of labour practice and to comply with all relevant human rights and employment legislation in their regions.

## Supplier Due Diligence

Our approach to supplier relationships reflects the same principles that shape our materials: informed choices, long-term thinking and careful attention to detail. Our process includes:

- Selecting suppliers who can demonstrate ethical labour practices
- Requesting documentation that sets out working standards and compliance
- Maintaining regular communication with manufacturing partners and visiting facilities when possible
- Building long-term relationships to support visibility and trust
- Reviewing prospective suppliers for risk indicators such as limited transparency, inconsistent documentation or unexpectedly low pricing

While our work involves established manufacturers and post-industrial waste streams, which carry relatively low labour risk, we remain attentive to potential issues.

**Risk Assessment and Mitigation**

We assess risk by considering location, material type and production methods. Where risks may be higher, we seek additional information to ensure that supplier practices meet our expectations. If any concerns were raised, we would investigate immediately and take corrective steps, including ending the relationship if required.

**Training and Awareness**

The LCI leadership team keeps informed about modern slavery risks within global supply chains. Team members involved in procurement and supplier management are made aware of the signs of modern slavery and the process for raising concerns.

**Reporting Concerns**

We encourage employees, suppliers and partners to report any concerns relating to labour standards. All concerns are taken seriously and handled with discretion.

**Continuous Improvement**

We are committed to improving the way we oversee labour practices in our supply chain. Our ongoing work includes:

- Increasing the depth of supplier documentation and auditing where appropriate
- Strengthening internal review processes
- Further refining supplier onboarding to reflect clear ethical expectations
